

APRIL 12, 2022

Supervisor Gregory Horr called the regular meeting of the North Dansville Town Board to order held at 14 Clara Barton Street Dansville NY, at 7:00 PM. Rollcall was taken, and found Councilperson Luce, Infantino, and Colella present. Absent Councilperson Bacon. Highway Superintendent MacWhorter was also in attendance. Guest signed in were Charlie Perkins, Kurt Gerber, Tara Coffey, and Julie Camacho.

Pledge to the Flag followed led by Councilperson Luce.

**PRIVILEGE OF THE FLOOR:**

Kurt Gerber: Depot Road resident who had a landslide on his property due to a wet Summer, Fall, and substantial amounts of melting snow. Mr. Gerber asked how much work is yet to be done? Highway Superintendent James MacWhorter states he has been up there daily to check on it and is waiting for it to dry up more. Him and his crew have cleaned up ditches and grated the East side of the hill. Mr. Gerber expressed thanks to Jim and his crew and is satisfied with the work being done.

Julie Camacho & Tara Coffey: Julie and Tara are part of Food Link. They reported on the two pop-up food pantries that they have held. The March 14<sup>th</sup> drive up pantry held at Babcock Park served 308 families, 790 individuals, and 171 vehicles. The April 11<sup>th</sup> drive-up pantry at the same location served 400 families, 1049 individuals with 184 vehicles. They expressed concern that Babcock Park is not feasible option in the coming months because of the amount of vehicles and sporting events taking place at the park. The board did not feel that Frontage Road would be a good option as there is not turn around and is also busy during the Spring and Summer months with sporting events. Ms. Coffey stated she is looking into the space at the old Main Tire building as an option. Supervisor Horr suggested Forbes Street would be a good option enter on Maple and exit out Main Street. He stated the Village would need to approve this and for a representative to attend the next Village meeting to be held on Tuesday April 19<sup>th</sup> at 7:00PM. A motion was made by Councilperson Colella, and a second by Luce for Food Link to utilize town property for drive through food pantries. All in favor. MOTION CARRIED.

Joe Plano: Mr. Plano is a pilot and member of the Pilots Association. He wanted to address the shortage of hangar space at the airport. Supervisor Horr stated that there is a waiting list for hangar space at the airport. Mr. Plano also wanted to address his concern about hearing the town wanted to close the airport and wanted to offer help from the Pilots association to make sure that does not happen. Supervisor Horr reassured Mr. Plano that the town has no plans to close the airport and currently has bids out to replace the roof. In 2024, Taxi C will be started, and runways to be replaced after that. Mr. Plano suggested adding an automatic fueling unit. Supervisor Horr stated that the Town was turned down for a grant for this, and the cost was extensive for this unit. Supervisor Horr offered to attend a Pilots Association meeting to discuss matters in further detail. Mr. Plano will get back with Supervisor on the date.

Deputy Clerk presented the minutes from the March 8, 2022, regular meeting, copy on file. A motion by Councilperson Luce and a second by Infantino to accept the minutes as presented. All in favor. MOTION CARRIED.

Town Clerk's report for the month of March 2022 was presented, copy on file. The report shows monies taken in for the month were \$2623.00 of which \$1997.17 was turned over to the Supervisor. A motion by Councilperson Luce and a second by Infantino to accept the report as presented. All in favor. MOTION CARRIED.

Zoning/Code Officer's report for the month of March 2022 was presented, copy on file. A motion by Councilperson Luce and a second by Councilperson Infantino to accept the report as presented. All in favor. MOTION CARRIED.

Justice reports from Justice Werth and Justice Weidman for the month of March 2022 were presented, copies on file. The report shows monies taken in for the month were \$7043.00 and \$1213.00 respectfully. A motion by Councilperson Infantino and a second by Councilperson Luce to accept the reports as presented. All in favor. MOTION CARRIED.

Town/Village Planning Board: No report. Supervisor Horr will check in with them as they should have a report even if they do not meet.

Town/Village Zoning Board of Appeals: No report. Supervisor Horr will check in with them as they should have a report even if they do not meet.

Executive Summary Report for the month of March 2022 was presented, copy on file. A motion by Councilperson Luce and a second by Colella to accept the report as presented. All in favor. MOTION CARRIED.

Committee Reports:

Cemetery report for the month of March 2022 was presented, copy on file. A motion by Councilperson Luce and a second by Infantino to accept the report as presented. All in favor. MOTION CARRIED.

Superintendent MacWhorter stated that someone was hired through the County Youth Program for the cemetery. It is part-time 25 hours per week, and they are paid by the County.

Highway: Superintendent MacWhorter states the new 1 Ton truck has been ordered. They will be taking the old truck to the Palmyra auction May 14<sup>th</sup>. Superintendent MacWhorter spoke about checking out roads to see what needs repair.

Charlie Perkins asked what the fee was that the Town workers get paid when the County requests help. MacWhorter responded \$102.00 per hour and that includes the driver. Mr. Perkins suggested that the Town and Village should work something out when help is needed and not go outside for help whenever possible. He would like to approach this at some point in the future.

Airport: Bid opening for the Airport roof project was April 6, 2022. Two bidders were present.

----JB Installation bid \$382,000.00

----Titan Roofing Bid \$399,899.00.

Supervisor Horr stated again that the price of materials has increased substantially. The grant received was for \$369,000.00, local share is \$45,000.00 for a total of \$414,000.00. Clark Paterson fee is \$50,000.00.

Recreation: Frontage Road Park is open, and a portable toilet has been delivered on site.

Solar Law: Councilperson Colella discussed putting a moratorium in place. He stated that if we do not have one in place, the profits would go to the state, and we would not get anything. A motion was made by Councilperson Colella and a second by Luce to set a moratorium. All in favor. MOTION CARRIED. There will be a public hearing at the May 10<sup>th</sup> meeting at 7:00PM. An advertisement will be placed in the Genesee Country Express stating such.

McWhorter Road: Supervisor Horr stated there has been no response from the Army Corps. He will go to Representative Jacobs for assistance.

Roof top air conditioner: Highway Superintendent MacWhorter stated that LMC currently has the maintenance contract. LMC states that the heat coil is bad and would be better if we bought a new unit. The cost is approximately \$14,000.00. The DMV unit is also having issues and it was suggested to replace them both at the same time, so we do not have the expense of renting a crane twice. Supervisor Horr stated it would have to be bid out and is estimating the cost to be about \$25,000.00 for both units.

County Update: Supervisor Horr stated that the nursing home continues to have staffing shortages. They have low occupancy because of the shortage. They are currently at 150.

MIN CONT.

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A motion by Councilperson Luce and a second by Infantino to pay all bills as audited, General Account Vouchers #38-#55 incl., totaling \$65,313.99 and Highway Account Vouchers #26-#35 incl., totaling \$6928.42. All in favor. MOTION CARRIED.

A motion by Councilperson Colella, and a second by Infantino to adjourn. All in favor. MOTION CARRIED.
